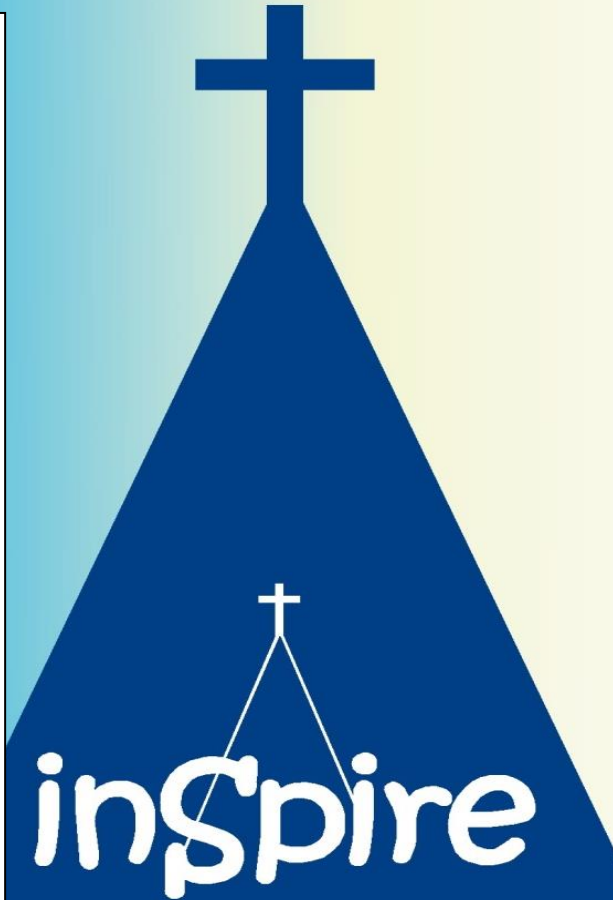
Start with your name or simple words like dog or cat.

Remember the dots are short taps/ashes and the dashes are long.

Younger children could try and learn the first letter of their name or they could use the invisible ink to draw pictures like we did on 23.4.20

Invisible ink! Young children might like to write a message in this way.....

Take a piece of white paper and write a message or draw a picture using lemon juice, orange juice or milk. (Squeeze the juice of a lemon and add a couple of drops of water.) You can paint with a paintbrush or a cotton wool bud.

Leave the paper to dry for 5 mins.

Heat is needed to make the picture magically appear. **(Supervise children carefully with this part)** put the paper under a desk lamp, over a radiator, use a hair dryer or place in an electric oven. (don't let the paper scorch!)

WOW! There's your message!
