It's easy to adapt lots of well-known games and play them using nothing more than pencils and paper. Why not play a game of Scattergories?

Write the letters of the alphabet on a piece of A4 paper (or if you have a plastic set at home you can use these). Cut the letters out and put them in a container.

Give everyone a pencil and paper. Decide what categories you want to use or use the ones listed below.

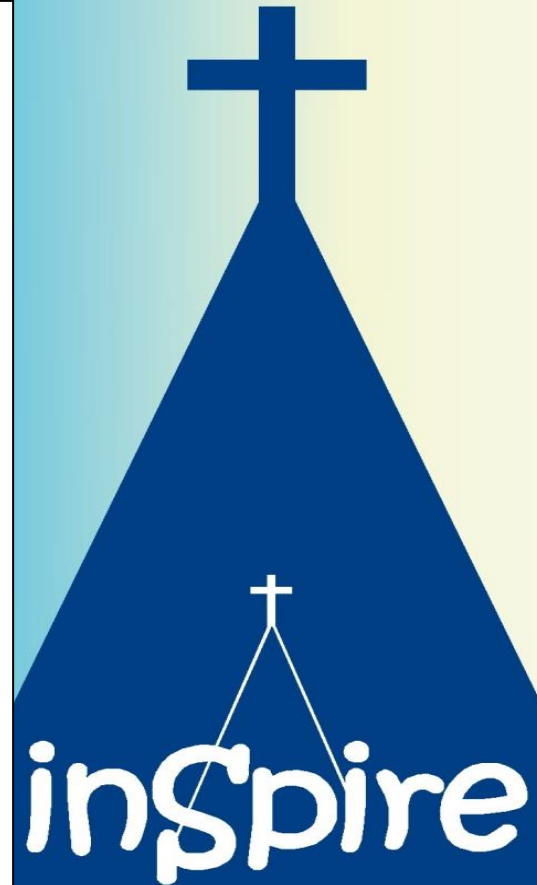
Ask the youngest person to take a letter out of the container. Give yourselves 2 mins for each category and write down as many as you can think of beginning with that letter eg. How many girl's names can you think of beginning with S?

Work your way through each category.

Younger children can play by just thinking of as many things as they can for each category.

A similar game could be played with very young children by asking them to find as many things as they can around the home that are different colours or different shapes.

You can either score points for each one you think of or make it more difficult and score a point for ones you have that nobody else has!
