Out of the box!

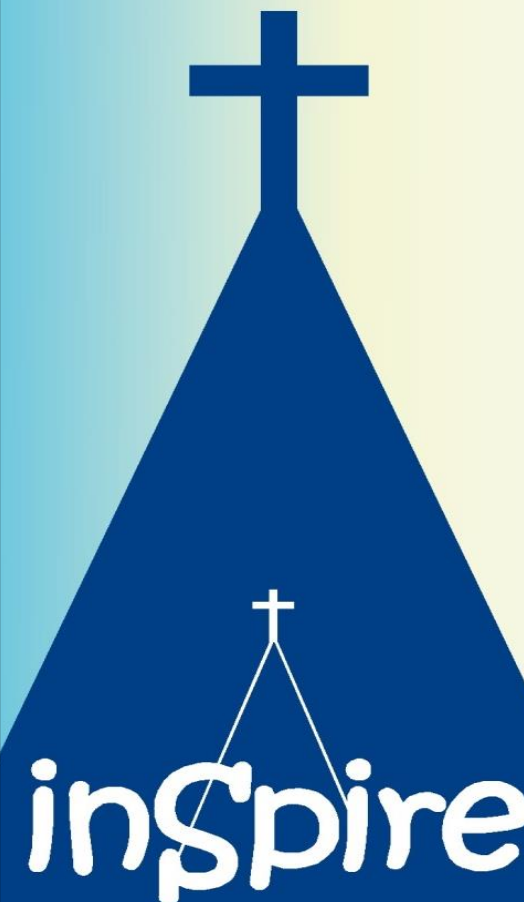
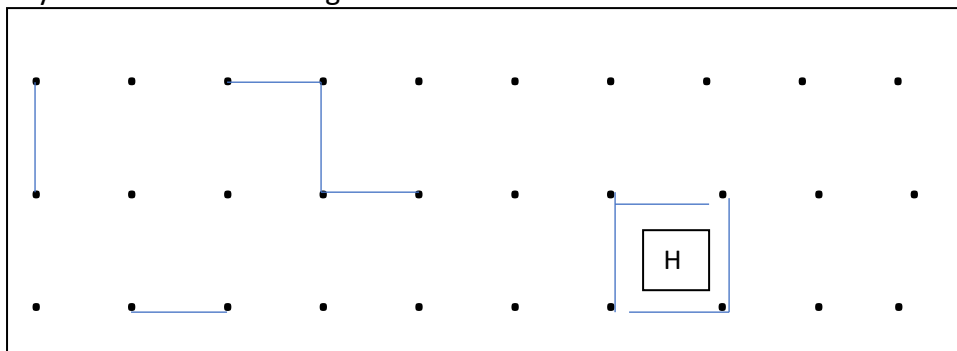
It's easy to adapt lots of well-known games and play them using nothing more than pencils and paper. We played Scattergories on 25th March (you can always play another game of that today !)

Here are some more good ideas to try out :

1. How many boxes? A quick, easy game for 2 or 3 people

Take a sheet of A4 paper. Mark it with a series of dots in grid format so that if they were joined they would make a square.

Take it in turns to draw lines, trying to make a square. When you have made a box, put your initial inside it and you can have another go. Who can make the most boxes?



2. Pictionary

Think of different things you can draw easily as a family (you can always make different sets of cards for different ages!! If you can, make them on different coloured paper to make the difficulty level clear.)

Easy: animals, vehicles, fruit, vegetables or other food, clothing, things around the house.

More difficult: sports, hobbies, places in the world, places in a town, countries (Paris, India), favourite books (Harry Potter), favourite songs, people's jobs, favourite films, people you know! 😊

The rules:

1. Make two teams
2. Take a card and draw a picture of that word for your team to guess.
3. Remember: No talking! Only drawing!
4. If your team guesses, your team gets a point.

You might like to set a time limit for each round.! If the team drawing can't guess in the time limit, the other team can have a guess! **ENJOY!**
