Lord for which they ask forgiveness using the ancient responses: **Or:**

Lord have mercy: **Lord have mercy,**
Christ have mercy: **Christ have mercy**
Lord have mercy: **Lord have mercy**

Forgiveness is offered in the name of God.

The Gloria may be sung

The Collect Concluding with: **Amen**

The Liturgy of the Word

At the end of the reading(s) the reader says

This is the word of the Lord.

All **Thanks be to God.**

HYMN

The Gospel Reading The reader says:

The Lord be with you. All: **And also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.
All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Prayers of Intercession

The Response: Lord, hear us. **Lord, graciously hear us**

Or Lord in your mercy: **Hear our prayer**

At the end: Merciful Father:

**accept these prayers for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen**

The Peace The president introduces the Peace and then says:

The peace of the Lord be always with you

All **and also with you.**

HYMN

This confession may be used

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry
and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
Who died for us,
forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life
to the glory of your name. **Amen.**

The Gloria may be sung after the confession

Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ,
only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right
hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen

A shortened Creed

We believe in God the Father,
from whom every family
in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son,
who lives in our hearts through faith,
and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit,
who strengthens us
with power from on high.

We believe in one God;
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer (The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving)

All The Lord be with you
and also with you.
Lift up your hearts.
All **We lift them to the Lord.**
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
All **It is right to give thanks and praise.**
Praise is given and then:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and God of might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes
in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest.**

*The prayer continues using the Lord's words
and invoking the Holy Spirit, then:*

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again
Praise is given, ending with the words; for ever and ever. **Amen**

The Lord's Prayer

A period of silence is kept before the president introduces the prayer

All **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come; thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

The president breaks the bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All **Though we are many, we are one body, because
we all share in one bread.**

Invitation to Communion

.....Blessed are those who are called to His supper

All **Lord I am not worthy to receive You,
but only say the word and I shall be healed**
